Harold Thomas Cottam - Titanic Hero





Harold Thomas Cottam, from Southwell (Nottinghamshire, England), was a 20-year-old wireless operator on board the *Carpathia* when *Titanic's* wireless operators were sending their distress calls.

Ready for bed, Cottam thought he'd check-in with *Titanic* one more time before leaving his office for the night. He received a surprising response - a distress message - from *Titanic*.

A series of communications between Cottam and the Titanic followed thereafter:

Titanic 12.20am: COME AT ONCE. WE HAVE STRUCK A BERG. IT'S A CQD, OLD MAN

Cottam 12.25am: SHALL I TELL MY CAPTAIN? DO YOU REQUIRE ASSISTANCE?

Titanic 12.26am: YES, COME QUICK

Cottam 12.32am: PUTTING ABOUT AND HEADING FOR YOU

Titanic 12.40am: SOS TITANIC SINKING BY THE HEAD. WE ARE ABOUT ALL DOWN

Although *Titanic* sank while the *Carpathia* was en route, Cottam's efforts helped to save around 700 people. Without his efforts, a rescue vessel would have arrived much later to the scene of the wreck.

This image depicts Harold Cottam aboard the *Carpathia* in 1912, at the beginning of his voyage. He lived until May of 1984 and was 93 years old at the time of his death.

Cottam has always been considered a "hero" of the Titanic disaster.
